Babers and Harmshay are grazed by Hereford-cross cattle and Zwartbles sheep, a rare breed originating from The Netherlands, owned by local farmer, Jim Strawbridge, while the farmland also provides a variety of habitats such as ditches, ponds, and woodlands. The farm features 5.79ha of SNCI running along a wooded watercourse and incorporating 3.78ha of pasture located to the south-west of the farm.

Notable flora observed at Babers Farm include: Corky-fruited water dropwort *Oenanthe pimpinelloides*, Meadow vetchling *Lathyrus pratensis*, Bird's-foot trefoil *Lotus corniculatus*, Common knapweed *Centaurea nigra*, Devil's-bit scabious *Succisa pratensis*, Oxeye daisy *Leucanthemum vulgare*, Agrimony *Agrimonia eupatoria*, Orchid spp., Adder's-tongue fern *Ophioglossum vulgatum*, Yellow-wort *Blackstonia perfoliata*, Yellow rattle *Rhinanthus minor* and Grass vetchling *Lathyrus nissolia*.



The NT North Dorset Ecology Group surveyed for Early Gentians last year on the hill and found good numbers in some areas, and disappointing in others! We're basing our surveys on Bryan Edward's 1997 suite of surveys where he surveyed many Dorset sites for the plant. Last year we were able to survey the Western slopes of the hill, so we will be primarily focussing on the top of the hillfort and the eastern ramparts this year.

Melbury Wood is the only site in Dorset where this epiparasitic plant grows, being associated with *Tricholoma* fungi within this beech woodland. The NT volunteers did a count in 2024 and recorded over 8,000 flowering spikes(!) and identified several new areas where they had not been seen previously. The aim of this survey would be to thoroughly survey those new areas to get a good idea of the distribution across the site. Some of the terrain is steep and quite slippery with beech leaves and mast, so suitable footwear and walking poles would be recommended.

Friday 3rd October. Introduction to Bryophytes Workshop, Kingcombe.

An Introduction to Bryophytes workshop for DFG members.

If you thought the winter months were the start of a lean time for botanists, think again! There's a significant but inexplicably overlooked group of small, but perfectly formed plants that could rescue you from winter gloom – mosses and liverworts! With over 450 spp. recorded in Dorset, there's more than enough for everyone. Bryophytes are at their best in the cool and damp seasons, so ideal as a botanist's winter alternative. With this introductory day in early autumn, in the bryophyte-rich Kingcombe NNR, and armed with a hand lens, you'll be all set for several months of botanical revelation.

The day will be a mix of informal teaching and examination of specimens. We'll be based at DWT's Kingcombe Centre, so have comfortable cover if it's wet. Ideally, we can spend some time inside, with collected samples and some information about mosses, and also take a short walk in the nearby nature reserve to see bryophytes in their habitats. So, with a view to spending some time outside, unless it's awful, come prepared for the weather and wet ground conditions. The aim for the day will be to get a basic understanding of bryophytes, and to see a few examples with identification tips, rather than amassing a long list of species; there's all winter for that.
